A NOTE FROM YOUR GENERAL MANAGER:

I hope to see all of you at Oktoberfest. It should be a good time with good food, good beer and lots of fun. Don't forget to bring your beer stein or purchase one from the SSCSD. All proceeds to this event assist our parks department and the various programs and activities it runs.

A few updates:

With some communication between parents and the School District, it appears that we now have a good working bus pick up process in place. The need for crosswalks and additional bus shelters is on the list to get done ASAP.

Cell Towers. Close to two years ago the District contacted the County of Kern in regard to the development of cell towers in Stallion. The County did a good job of explaining the issues that the Federal Government had with lack of service in this area and politely explained that our local agency, the SSCSD should not be involved in this process. Some residents feel that better cell services are essential for life and safety issues and others feel very strongly that a cell tower should not be in their backyard. The District staff and Board Members respect both views and

would suggest that all residents stay in touch with the County of Kern in regard to the ongoing process of cell towers in this community.

Horse Thief Lake. The project of removing growth in the lake and around the lake and attempting to clean up the area is close to completion. The District will put the Weir boards in place so that the lake can be filled again and hopefully find a vendor that will allow us to stock the lake with fish. We hope to see this project completed by the end of October.

Sewer Lift Station. This project is nearing completion and the District will then have a reliable lift station that effectively and efficiently moves raw sewage from the District to the Wastewater Plant.

Other Notes. We are expecting to paint limit lines and cross walks over the next 60 days and start exercising the water system, valves, hydrants and a long list of other items to do.

How to suggestions:

Use empty plant pots or plastic water bottles to fill the body and legs.

Used grocery bags make great stuffing.

A plastic plant pot can be stapled to the top as a head form for your burlap. Raffia can be bought in different colors to make hair.

Landscape fabric is useful and cheap for fashioning hair and clothing.



What can I use to stuff my scarecrow?

Strategically stuff the shirt to fill out your scarecrow. Straw, hay, leaves, grass clippings, wood chips and rags are all acceptable stuffing materials. Try to avoid using newspaper to stuff your scarecrow, however, as rainfall may cause it to become soggy and shapeless.

What can I use for the head of my scarecrow?

Get creative! A burlap bag or sack is traditional - but a box, bucket, pillowcase, or pumpkin could be fun and festive too!

Once your scarecrows are complete, keep them safe until Halloween! Then bring them down to Woodward West for display and judging. They should stand on their own and be self-sustained. Drop off times and location will be announced soon and will depend on weather.

ONLINE BILL PAY

Owners: You need to register your account online, or use Quick Pay. You will need your full account number.

Renters: All renters can ONLY use Quick Pay. Please DO NOT register account, this belongs to the owner, and will change their information on the account.

AUTO PAY and PHONE PAYMENTS are also available. Auto Pay is available to all owner registered accounts. Once your information has been verified and your bill is paid in full, you can set up auto pay to pay your bill in full on the due date. The due dates are the 20th day of every odd month.

To use the Phone Payment System call 661-825-

1515. Have your full account number, amount due and credit card available.

We accept Visa, MasterCard, AMEX and Discover. (Online Transaction fee is added and will be displayed before you submit your payment).

The CSD office will only receive cash or check.

Information regarding your Bi-Monthly water bill & sewer charge

Water: Your service charge (base rate) on your water bill will be changing in this next billing cycle to \$42.97 if you have a 3/4" water meter and - \$71.76 if you have a 1" water meter for the fiscal year 19-20.

Sewer: Your service charge will be changing in this next billing cycle to \$110.00.

JUST A HEADS UP ABOUT WATER PAY-MENTS....

When you use your bill payment system to pay Stallion Springs CSD, your bank writes a check and it is sent by mail.

Your bank may take money out of your account today, but not write a check for up to 10 days after your request.

We may not get your payment for up to 14 days after your request.

SSCSD offers credit card payments thru our website www.stallionspringscsd.com and we now offer Phone payments and Auto payments by calling: 661-825-1515.

There is a minimum processing charge for the online credit card payments, but the payments are processed immediately.
