A few updates:

TRASH/RECYCLING:

The trash site has been fully operational for a few months now and WOW what a difference! We have already seen a big decrease, not only in the volume but the type of trash. Thank you to all of those that have been following the trash rules and helping us keep things in compliance with the county. Unfortunately, the recycling area and program is at a stand still for now. I have been desperately trying to find outside resources to help with recycling and the costs involved but due to the recent changes in recycling I have not had the outcome I had hoped for. Right now, because we are not mandated to recycle yet I do not think it would be wise to add this cost to the District until we are forced to. I want to thank you all for your patience on this and still encourage you all to recycle if you can. You can hang on to these items or you can take them to the various recycle centers in the Tehachapi area. IMPORTANT!! There is only ONE vehicle allowed

through the gate at a time. DO NOT try to tailgate someone to get in. This will not only result in damage to your vehicle but the gate as well and WILL result in a minimum \$100 fine. If your tag is not working keep calm and call the office at 822-3268. If it is after hours there is still help available, call the office and you will receive an after hours number for help.

ROADS:

Some of our roads have been oiled and we plan to get the restriped in the next few weeks. We will be adding some crosswalks at the bus stops for the safety of our kids. Although school is not back in session yet we ask that you are mindful of ALL the bus stops in the Community. School will hopefully reopen soon and when it does, we want to keep our kids safe. Remember to watch for the busses and their flashing lights, kids crossing the roads and parents coming to and from the bus stops. If you aren't aware of the bus stop locations please call the front office and we can give you more information. Also, I have had numerous complaints about speeding in the community and it shocks me how fast some are driving. Please remember this is a neighborhood full of kids and wildlife. LOTS of wildlife this year so please SLOW DOWN and enjoy the beautiful scenery [



JUST A HEADS UP ABOUT WATER PAYMENTS....

When you use your bill payment system to pay Stallion Springs CSD, your bank writes a check and it is sent by mail.

Your bank may take money out of your account today, but not write a check for up to 10 days after your request.

We may not get your payment for up to 14 days after your request.

SSCSD offers credit card payments thru our website www.stallionspringscsd.com and we now offer Phone payments and Auto payments by calling: 661-825-1515.

There is a minimum processing charge for the online credit card payments, but the payments are processed immediately.

IMPORTANT: FISHING PERMIT IS REQUIRED AT ALL TIMES:

Fishing without a permit will result in a fine. 48 hour permits are available at the Stallion Springs General Store or the CSD for \$10. Yearly permits are available at the District Office ONLY Monday thru Friday, 8 a.m.— 4:15 p.m. (closed from 12—1). *IMPORTANT* No fishing from the bridge or on or near the dam.

What you will find in your water bill....

<u>Description</u>: is where you will find what you are paying for or if you have a previous balance.

Recharge fee— is the amount you pay if you have not signed a covenant. This fee can be eliminated if you come into the office and have a form notarized.

Water—this is the water you used for two months.

Sewer—if you have sewer services.

Refuse—Trash

<u>Service Charge</u>— is the Base Rate that will be charged whether you use water or not.

Penalties— is the fee that is added if not paid by the 20th of the due date.











FOR THE NEXT PUBLIC SAFETY POWER SHUTOFF?

PAY ONLINE! Pay your water bill anytime, anywhere. Online Bill Pay makes it easy for you to manage your water bill. You can view your bill, see payment history, etc. You can even do auto pay. Owners can register or use Quick Pay. Renter's Only use Quick Pay. Go to our website at www.stallionspringscsd.com. It is located on the Home Page.

Please be advised that the Main District Water Valve should never be turned at your meter. By doing this, it may cause damage or may be broken which will cause water shut offs not only to your residence, but to a whole neighborhood. Thank you.

Recommended: All customers should have their own customer valve for shutting off water.

INFORMATION AND NOTES

- For emergency police, fire and medical calls dial 911 and specify to the dispatcher that you live in Stallion Springs. To reach the police for nonemergency purposes, contact Kern County Dispatch at (800) or (661) 861-3110.
- California law states that dogs must be on a leash. Please follow this rule. Stallion Springs Police will be working with Kern County Animal Control in regard to ticketing violators.
- ♦ For District emergencies off hours, such as a main line water break you may call 822-3268. Leave a message with the problem, your name and contact number and an on-call District staff will be paged.
