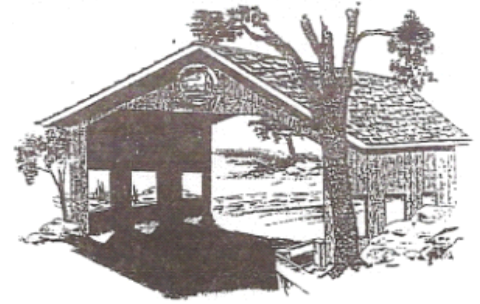

Stallion Springs Community:

Changes are instore for Stallion Springs in the New Year. After the holidays, be on the look out for a letter from the CSD in regard to your solid waste and how the CSD has limited options in handling it. The letter will include a detailed explanation. We will be asking for you to fill out a survey and **RETURN RESPONSE**. Based on the survey, we will then have a town hall meeting to make decisions in regard to solid waste.

The District will be looking at officially being on Facebook and Instagram media starting in early 2020. We are hopeful that this will provide accurate information to our residents.

In January we will be exercising the fire hydrants and water lines throughout the District. Please let us know if you experience any problems with your water supply during this time.

I am very proud of this community, the volunteers and our residents. The power outages that Stallion experienced were very trying on everyone but our staff kept the facilities running with generators, our police, with the assistance of CERT, kept those in need cared for and our residents remained calm. Thank you. The District continues to work with Kern County Emergency Operating Center and California

Special District Association (CSDA) in attempting to obtain some funding for a large generator in case of a large evacuation need.

The Yellow Star Thistle, which some say is a dirty word, has returned and we need your help. It is an invasive weed that at one point was eradicated in Stallion. If you have the weed on your property, please remove it by hand by digging it up (do not weed whack). Place the weed in bags and dispose in the dumpsters (this will be an exception to the rule, no bags in green waste bins). If these are not disposed of properly, the seeds will spread. If you see the weed on District property, please let us know the location and our staff will remove it. Later in 2020, we will be spraying the weed so we do need to know all locations of this Star Thistle. If you are not familiar with Yellow Star Thistle come by the office to view some pictures.

Be safe and remember to keep your pipes from freezing this winter.

The office will be closed Dec. 24 thru Dec 27, 2019.

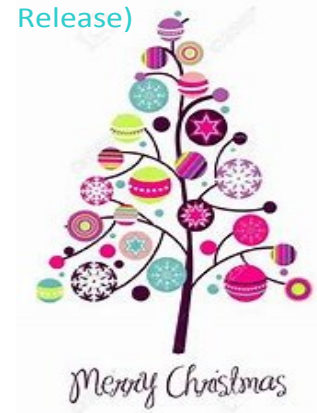

Frozen pipes can present an invisible threat – one that you might not recognize until the weather starts to warm. By then, the [water damage can be significant and costly](#). Fortunately, keeping your home warmer, at a consistent temperature, and better insulated can help protect your pipes from freezing this winter.

Which Pipes Are Most at Risk?

Pipes that are most exposed to the elements, including those outdoors and along the exterior walls of your home, may need extra protection during winter months. These include the following:

- Outdoor hose hookups and faucets.
- Swimming pool supply lines.
- Lawn sprinkler lines.
- Water pipes in unheated, interior locations such as basements, crawl spaces, attics, garages and kitchen and bathroom cabinets.

Pipes running against exterior walls with little or no insulation.

How to Help Prevent Frozen Pipes

Before winter:

- Check your home for areas where water pipes are located in unheated or poorly insulated areas. Be sure to check your basement, attic, crawl space, garage and within cabinets containing plumbing. Hot and cold water pipes should both be insulated.

Products such as pipe sleeves or UL-listed heat tape or heat cable can help insulate or heat exposed water pipes.

During winter:

- Close inside valves supplying water to outdoor faucets and hookups.
- Open outdoor faucets to allow residual water to drain; be sure to

keep them open during the cold weather months, while the water supply is turned off.

- Keep garage doors closed to help protect water pipes located in the garage.
- Open the doors on cabinets where plumbing is located. This can help allow warmer air to circulate around the pipes.
- For pipes that are at risk of freezing (both hot and cold water pipes), let water drip from faucets.

[Keep the heat in your home](#) set at a minimum of 55 degrees.

Why is a Frozen Pipe a Concern?

When water begins to freeze, it expands. This can cause both plastic and metal pipes to burst, possibly leading to significant water damage to your home.

- Since water expands when it freezes, it puts unwanted pressure on pipes.
- As water freezes, the force exerted from the expansion can cause a pipe to burst, regardless of the strength of the material.

You may not know you have a burst pipe as the water has turned to ice. Once the temperature starts to warm and thawing begins, leaking and flooding can occur.

What Do You Do if You Have a Frozen Pipe?

If you have a leak, turn the water off immediately to prevent water damage and call a licensed plumber to make repairs. If your home is heated by an older steam heating system, consult with your heating professional to determine if it is safe to continue to run the heating system with the water supply turned off for your particular heating system.

full on the due date. The due dates are the 20th day of every odd month. To use the **Phone Payment** System call 661-825-1515. Have your full account number, amount due and credit card available.

We accept Visa, MasterCard, AMEX and Discover. (Online Transaction fee is added and will be displayed before you submit your payment).

When you use your bill payment system to pay Stallion Springs CSD, your bank writes a check and it is sent by mail.

Your bank may take money out of your account today, but not write a check for up to 10 days after your request.

We may not get your payment for up to 14 days after your request.

SSCSD offers credit card payments thru our website www.stallionspringscsd.com and we now offer Phone payments and Auto payments by calling: 661-825-1515.

There is a minimum processing charge for the online credit card payments, but the payments are processed immediately.

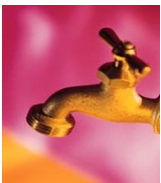

Please be advised that the Main District Water Valve should never be turned at your meter. By doing this, it may cause damage or may be broken which will cause water shut offs not only to your residence, but to a whole neighborhood. Thank you.

Recommended: All customers should have their own customer valve for shutting off water.

INFORMATION AND NOTES

- ◆ For emergency police, fire and medical calls dial 911 and specify to the dispatcher that you live in Stallion Springs. To reach the police for non-emergency purposes, contact Kern County Dispatch at (800) or (661) 861-3110.
