There are Conditions, Covenants and Restrictions that everyone is responsible for following. If you have questions, we will be happy to answer them but please understand that abiding by the CC&R's is good for the community and can prevent the District staff from spending time on attempting to be enforcers instead of service providers.

The District has Titles or Ordinances in place. These are legal requirements that the District is obligated to follow. For example, ingress and egress of district roads onto driveways is outlined in the District Titles. Failure for residents to abide by those rules can destroy curbs and be a traffic hazard. Dogs are mans best friend but not when the owner fails too abide by leash laws or keep their animal quiet. Please respect others in regard to control of your animals.

Weeds and growth around homes is a fire danger. Help the District, the Fire Department and your neighbors by keeping growth around homes down so that there is defensible space and your property looks nice.

We should all be respectful of others. A big help to the District in regard to time and resources is for neighbors to talk to neighbors in attempting to work out difficulties.

Get the monthly pass and you can take any or all exercise classes or try a class for \$5 resident, \$7 non-resident.





## JUST A HEADS UP ABOUT WATER PAY-MENTS....

When you use bill payment system to pay Stallion Springs CSD, your bank writes a check and it is sent by mail.

Your bank may take money out of your account today, but not write a check for up to 10 days after your request.

We may not get your payment for up to 14 days after your request.

SSCSD offers credit card payments thru our website www.stallionspringscsd.com and we now offer Phone payments and Auto payments by calling: 661-825-1515.

There is a minimum processing charge for the online credit card payments, but the payments are processed immediately.



# *NEW* - ONLINE BILL PAY

Owners: You need to register your account online, or use Quick Pay. You will need your full account number.

Renters: All renters can ONLY use Quick Pay. Please DO NOT register account, this belongs to the owner, and will change their information on the account.

AUTO PAY and PHONE PAYMENTS are also available. Auto Pay is available to all owner registered accounts. Once your information has been verified and your bill is paid in full, you can set up auto pay to pay your bill in full on the due date. The due dates are the 20th day of every odd month. To use the Phone Payment System call 661-825-1515. Have your full account number, amount due and credit card available.

We accept Visa, MasterCard, AMEX and Discover. (Online Transaction fee is added and will be displayed before you submit your payment).

The CSD office will only receive cash or check.

Friendly Reminder: Online bill pay is offline at the end of each month.
