Monday: 4 pm Ballet/Tap Level 2 (must have already taken 12 hours of dance)



Renters: All renters can ONLY use Quick Pay. Please DO NOT register account, this belongs to the owner, and will change their information on the account.

AUTO PAY and PHONE PAYMENTS are also available. Auto Pay is available to all owner registered accounts. Once your information has been verified and your bill is paid in full, you can set up auto pay to pay your bill in full on the due date. The due dates are month. To use the Phone Payment System call full account number, amount due and credit card available.

We accept Visa, Master-Card, AMEX and Discover. (Online Transaction fee is added and will be displayed before you submit your payment).

The CSD office will only receive cash or check.

Friendly Reminder: Online bill pay offline 5-7 Business days before the end the month.

Information regarding your Bi-Monthly water bill & sewer charge

Water: Your service charge (base rate) on your water bill will be changing in this next billing cycle to \$42.97 if you have a 3/4" water meter and - \$71.76 if you have a 1" water meter for the fiscal year 19-20.

Sewer: Your service charge will be changing in this next billing cycle to \$110.00.

JUST A HEADS UP ABOUT WATER PAY-MENTS....

When you use your bill payment system to pay Stallion Springs CSD, your bank writes a check and it is sent by mail.

Your bank may take money out of your account today, but not write a check for up to 10 days after your request.

We may not get your payment for up to 14 days after your request.

SSCSD offers credit card payments thru our website www.stallionspringscsd.com and we now offer Phone payments and Auto payments by calling: 661-825-1515.

There is a minimum processing charge for the online credit card payments, but the payments are processed immediately.

Owners can register or use Quick Pay. Renter's Only use Quick Pay. Go to our website at www.stallionspringscsd.com. It is located on the Home Page.

Please be advised that the Main District Water Valve should never be turned at your meter. By doing this, it may cause damage or may be broken which will cause water shut offs not only to your residence, but to a whole neighborhood. Thank you.

Recommended: All customers should have their own customer valve for shutting off water.

INFORMATION AND NOTES
