#### UNREPORTED CRIMES

If a tree falls in the forest and nobody is around, does it make a sound? If a crime occurs and nobody reports it, did it actually occur? Since I began a Neighborhood Watch program with resident block Captain Joan Clark in Stallion Springs, unreported crime has been amongst our most talked about dilemmas. Nothing is quite as frustrating as a resident advising the Police Department, "About two weeks ago, I saw this guy..." And so on. Many crimes go unsolved because somebody saw something but failed to report it in a timely manner, or worse, didn't report social media sites to report crime, failing to realize that Facebook is not a Police Department, nor do they hire police officers to investigate crimes. Crime mainly gets reported to us in one of three ways: through dispatch, email, or phoning the station. The best case scenario is receiving a call through dispatch,

(800) 861-3110 as it is the fastest and most effective way. Calls are recorded, the dispatchers know what pertinent and relevant information to ask and they can get ahold of us almost immediately. Emails are somewhat effective but these should normally be reserved for general questions and passing along information that is not time sensitive. Lastly, a phone call to the station is the slowest method as the officer will get the message when they happen to pass through the office or receive a phone call from the station. Remember that observation only affects outcome if it is reported quickly and correctly. Please join us at our monthly Neighborhood it all. Many people turn to Facebook or other Watch meetings on the fourth Tuesday of every month, 6:30pm at the Stallion Springs Community Police Station. During the meetings, we discuss current crime trends, scams and how best to work with your police department to assist in fighting crime.

Owners: You need to register your account online, or use Quick Pay. You will need your full account number.

Renters: All renters can ONLY use Quick Pay. Please DO NOT register account, this belongs to the owner, and will change their information on the account.

Once your information has been verified and your bill is paid in full, you can set up auto pay to pay your bill in full on the due date. The due dates are the 20th day of every odd month. Every summer for 11 weeks we provide thousands of children that exact experience. In addition, we offer a November Scooter Camp and a December Winter Camp.

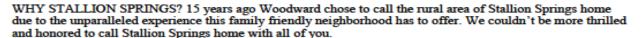
#### HOW CAN WE AS A COMMUNITY EXPEIRENCE WOODWARD?
